THE GOSPEL READING FOR THIS WEEK IS John 12: 20-33

This week's theme

This week's theme is "seeds" and we are thinking about how amazing it is that new life grows from lifeless seeds.

Extracts from the Gospel passage (John 12: 23-24)

Things to think about

- Have you ever planted seeds and watched them grow?
- Do all of the seeds grow into plants?
- How can you help seeds to grow?

Things to do

- **Plant some seeds** in small pots filled with compost. Watch them grow and when they are big enough, and the weather is warmer, you can plant them in your garden or into bigger pots.
- **Decorate plant pots** so they look colourful until the flowers have grown. If you are putting the pots outside, you will need to use acrylic paint and perhaps varnish them with diluted PVA glue.
- **Grasshead characters.**

You will need: Old tights, compost or garden soil, grass seeds, elastic band, googly eyes, plant pot



Place a generous amount of grass seeds in the foot of the tights. You will need someone to hold the tights whilst you pour the seeds in.



Then fill with the soil until you have a nice spherical shape. Again, this is best done by two people.



Twist and tie the tights cutting off any excess material.



Make a nose by twisting a small section and tying with the elastic band.



When the soil is a little dryer, decorate by adding a face and then place on top of the pot. You might want to decorate the pot too!

Make sure the soil is kept damp but not sodden, place in a sunny spot and watch the hair grow!

You may need to give your grasshead a haircut eventually!

Different ways to make grassheads.

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Why not make a family of grassheads? Or perhaps make your favourite book, TV or film characters.

As a quicker alternative, try growing cress on damp cotton wool or kitchen towel inside a boiled egg shell. You can draw a face on the shell and should see the cress growing in a couple of days.
