Donkey

THE GOSPEL READING FOR THIS WEEK IS: Jesus' entry into Jerusalem (Luke 19: 28-40)

Core extract from the Gospel (Luke 19: 35-38; for reflection throughout the week)

Then they brought the colt to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it.

As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road.

As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!'

Gospel prayer (for use throughout the week)

Lord Jesus Christ, when you rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, you were greeted with shouts of praise. Yours is the glory, Yours is the kingdom, Yours is the praise, now and always. Amen.



Things to think about

- Have you ever ridden on a donkey or a horse?
- Why do you think Jesus chose a donkey?
- Why do you think it had to be a colt (young donkey) that had never been ridden before?

Things to do


- See if you can visit a local farm, zoo or wildlife park. Perhaps there is a local donkey sanctuary near you.
- Make hand and/or footprint donkey prints
- Paper donkey bookmark

You will need: a square piece of grey paper, extra pieces of grey, black. Pink and white paper, scissors, glue, googly eyes.





Fold the square paper to make a triangle







Unfold the last step and fold the uppermost point down to the base.





Now bring the corners up and tuck behind.



Make ears, hair, nose and teeth from the other colours of paper.

Attach to the donkey's face and use as a bookmark.
