Easter Bunny

THE GOSPEL READING FOR THIS WEEK IS: The empty tomb (Luke 24: 1-12)

Core extract from the Gospel (Luke 24: 1-5; for reflection throughout the week)

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women who had accompanied Jesus came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared.

They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body.

While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. the women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen.'

Gospel prayer (for use throughout the week)

Lord Jesus Christ, you are risen from the tomb, alleluia, alleluia! Bring us to share the new life of your Easter resurrection, that we may live with you for ever; for you are risen from the tomb, alleluia, alleluia! Amen.

- What other signs of new life can you think of?




Things to do

You will need: Paper, scissors, glue, googly eyes, pom-pom, felt pens or crayons.







Curl and glue these sections together.





Cut a smaller rectangle, fold in half and cut to make the feet. Stick this to the first piece.

Draw a circle, add ears and cut out.

Add pink paper or draw the centre of the bunny's ears.

Stick on the googly eyes and draw the mouth and whiskers. You may want to use a pom-pom for the nose!





Concertina another rectangle of paper and stick to the back of the face and the front of the body.

You may want to add a fluffy pom-pom for a tail and perhaps back paws too.
