and they asked him,
'Teacher, what should we do?'
He said to them,

You will need: Plain paper, potato, knife, paint



Cut the potato in half and draw your design. You might want to use a biscuit cutter to help with the shape.

Carefully cut round the shapes.



Press the potato into the paint

Print your design onto the plain paper. When this is dry, use it to wrap your presents.
