You will need: paper, scissors, colouring pens or pencils, string or ribbon






Draw the outline of a bird, without wings, on thin card or paper and cut out.





Cut a slit in the middle of the body.







Use another piece of thin paper to make the wings by folding in a concertina style.

Push the wings through the slit in the body and open out.

Attach the bird to the string.

You could add more birds to the string or have each bird on a different piece of string.
