This week's theme is 'Sincere smiles'.

Core extract from the Gospel (Mark 12: 28-31; for reflection throughout the week)

One of the scribes asked Jesus, 'Which commandment is the first of all?' Jesus answered, 'The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these.'

Hang each face from the paper plate with string or wool and add a hanging string to the other side of the plate.
