Things to think about

- Have you ever seen a building been demolished? What did it look like? What could you hear or smell?
- Why do buildings need to be demolished?
- What things can you think of that last forever?

Things to do

- Build a tower from wooden or plastic building blocks. How high can you build before it comes crashing down?
- Collect boxes and then build a tower to knock down with a football this is best done outside
- Balloon demolition game.

You will need: paper cups, balloon



Stack the cups up to build a wall. Or alternatively, set them out like skittles.

Inflate the balloon and then slowly release the air to try and knock down the cups.



You could see how fast you can knock them all down or how many you can knock down within a time limit. Perhaps you could use different coloured cups and try to aim for specific colours.
