LADDERS

THE GOSPEL READING FOR THIS WEEK IS John 1: 43-51

This week's theme

This week's theme is 'ladders' where we recognise that Jesus is a link between Heaven and Earth just as ladders act as links between places.

Extracts from the Gospel passage (John 1: 49-51)

Nathanael replied,
'Rabbi, you are the Son of God!
You are the King of Israel!'
Jesus answered,
'Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree?
You will see greater things than these.'
And he said to him, 'Very truly,
I tell you, you will see heaven opened
and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.'

Gospel prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, your love links heaven and earth. Lift our eyes to the highest heavens and set our hearts on your true love, so where you are we may be also; now and for ever. Amen.



Things to think about

- Think of all the ladders you have seen or even used.
- What were they made of?
- What did they help you to reach?
- Did you need to have someone else holding the ladder and keep you safe?
- If you could use a ladder to reach another place, where would you choose to go?

Things to do

- Snakes and ladders game. Draw a squared grid on a large piece of paper and number each square. Now draw as many snakes and ladders on the grid as you would like. You may wish to colour the game too. Play the games as normal but each time you land on a ladder, say thank you to God for something you have enjoyed or been blessed by this week. Each time you land on a snake, ask God to help someone you feel may be in need of thoughts and prayers.
- **Build your own model ladder** using any modelling materials you may have bricks, craft sticks, lego perhaps even paper or card. Use this as a focus for your reflections this week. What's the tallest structure you can make? You may want to create an angel that moves up and down the ladder too.
- **Jacob's Ladder**. Have a go at making one of these using card and ribbon. It could also be used as a focus for your prayers and reflections.

You will need: 7 squares of paper or card, funky foam, wooden blocks or even chocolate bars!3 strips of paper per square; 3 x longer than the squares. I used 2 different colours for the paper strips.





Stick one paper strip in the middle of each square and fold the extra behind. Do this for all 6 squares.





Turn the squares round so the strip is now on the right hand side. Now glue another strip on either side and fold behind. Repeat this with each square



Fold all strips back out and let the glue dry.

Place the first square with the glued side underneath and fold the strips over the side facing you.

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Take another square and place the glued side on top of the square on the table making sure the middle strips are on opposite sides.





Fold in and glue the short strips. Fold the remaining strips over but do not glue!



Repeat steps 5 and 6 until you run out of squares. Remember to only glue the short strips! Use the 7th square to finish off the ladder gluing on the remaining strips.



You can now make the pieces look as if they are falling from the top to the bottom!
