# Wedding Reception

**THE GOSPEL READING FOR THIS WEEK IS: Wedding at Cana (John 2:1-11)**

*This week's theme is "Wedding Reception"*

*Core extract from the Gospel (John 2: 1-11; for reflection throughout the week)*

There was a wedding in Cana of Galilee,  
and the mother of Jesus was there.  
Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding.  
When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him,  
'They have no wine.'

*Gospel prayer (for use throughout the week)*

Lord Jesus Christ,  
you were welcomed to the wedding at Cana.  
Make us ready to be welcomed  
to the feast in your kingdom;  
for you are our God.  
Amen.



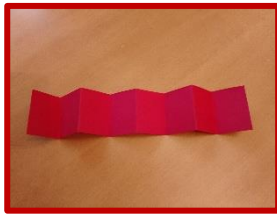
*Things to think about*

*Things to do*

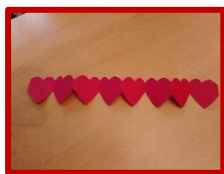
- Make a tea light holder by punching or cutting out hearts in a gift bag. This could be used as a table decoration by placing battery operated candles inside.
- Make a collection of wedding photos as a reminder of a special day.
- Paper heart decorations 3 ways!

You will need: scissors, coloured paper, stapler, sticky tape.



Concertina fold a strip of paper or card.

Draw a heart on one space making sure the edges of the heart touch the folds of the paper.



Now cut out the heart and open up the paper strip.

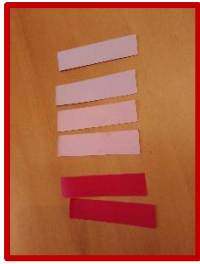


Draw and cut out hearts and cut out a heart shape from the centre.



Cut the bottom edge and link the hearts together. When linked, stick the edges back together with tape on the reverse.

## SECOND SUNDAY OF EPIPHANY (YEAR C) Sunday 16 January 2022



Cut strips of coloured paper.

Staple 2 together at the top to make a heart shape



Add two more strips at the bottom facing up.

Fold these down to make a new heart. Repeat this until you have a long strip of hearts.
